

Underlying concept 1/3


Dual approach

Top-down

- Conventional oaths: Impart value system top-down
- Asking questions instead of giving prearranged answers




Underlying concept 3/3

Bottom-up

- Antitype: EBSOS-system at which the students create a new Oath every year class for themselves
- Yet goal of the IIS: Every student shall be given the opportunity to put his/her most important values or the essence of what ,,decency" means to him/her on record for to be able to look back on these believes at a later point in time.
- Second goal of the IIS is to show possible problematic situations as much related to practice as possible and to discuss options how to act in such situations.
- Instruments to reach those goals: Workshops and/or tutorials
 with alumni, which have already joined the IIS Club
