How to get to the Youth Hostel from St. Gallen Central Station?


Take the Trogenerbähnli tram (S12) to "Birnbäume" stop and walk 2 minutes.

Learning Circles Workshops

SWITZERLAND CURRENCY

Please note that Switzerland's currency is the Swiss Franc (abbreviated to CHF). While Switzerland is not part of the European Union and thus is not obliged to utilize the Euro, many prices are nonetheless indicated in Euro. Merchants may accept Euros but are not obliged to do so. Change given back to the client will most likely be in CHF.

NB: Official exchange offices and hotels may charge a fee for their services.



BUSINESS HOURS

Shops in smaller towns and villages are generally open from 8:30 - noon and again from 14:00 - 18.30. In larger cities they do not close for lunch. In larger cities, shops generally extend their hours till 20:00 on one evening of the week.

If calling from Switzerland, you need to enter the international country code (+41). The country code is followed by the area code (without the 'o') as shown in the following example: "+41221123456". As a rule, the "+" sign appears if you press and hold the "o" key for a few seconds.

ELECTRICITY

The current used throughout Switzerland is 230 Volts (AC), 50 cycles. Most power sockets are designed for three pin round plugs. The standard continental type plug with two round pins, applied for many electrical travel products.
